I was out for a morning walk with my dog, Sis, in my neighborhood, when I experienced the most blessed of things: a cool breeze that could only be described as one thing: Fall. You see, October is my Zen. It's my go-to jam. Wood smoke, fallen leaves, apples and spices. Pumpkin patches and hayrides. A good friends' Annual "Chili-palooza" at her house. And on and on the list of smells goes. Death and decay never smelled so good. "We made it!" After months of heat and humidity, we made it! That's how I often feel when we get to October. In some ways that probably sounds odd. Fall, after all, is when things start to get busy for families, schools, and churches. But it's a busyness with a purpose, with an aim. It's akin to reaching the top of a rollercoaster at Kennywood and peering down the slope below. (That is if you keep your eyes open on rollercoasters!) Sure, things are about to speed up—but this is the part we all came for.

And sure, it is the season that ushers in a sense of death, of letting go in favor of what is to come. As the popular saying goes, "the leaves are about to show us how lovely it is to let dead things go." Not in a macabre sense. But in a death to new life sense. A reminder that even though the trees will become bare, that doesn't mean that they have ceased to exist. They simply shed what is dead in order to continue to live. Yes, this is the good stuff right now.

Throughout October we are surrounded by images of dying, not only in the natural world of harvested fields and trees giving up their leaves but also upon every store shelf and front porch. Halloween comes, bearing with it legions of grinning skulls, spider webs, ghouls and goblins and nightmare-inducing characters of every conceivable variety.


At Halloween you can be anything, anyone: a rock god, a movie star, a werewolf or a fairy. You can indulge in fantasy, in superstition, in a good and hearty scare. The usual boundaries are broken down. The usual rules don't apply. And while this most American of celebrations has become almost completely secularized, nevertheless its Christian roots show through in the laughter that accompanies all these images of horror.

Because we all know that not only is death wrong but it is downright scary. No matter the amount of faith that you believe to possess, deep down we are all afraid of dying. Of the unknown: when will it happen? Will I feel anything? What about my family? Try as we might to ignore our fears, in comes death to surprise us, to remind us of its presence, and to make us afraid.

Yet, as baptized Christians, even death doesn't have the final say over us. For in Christ, we have made it. To live beyond death, beyond the grave, in the Lord's eternal love and embrace. To know that whether we live or whether we die we are the Lord's.

So, hang up your decorations. Drink your pumpkin spice beverage without shame. And know that in the end, whatever is dead will rise again from the dust and ashes, as the Lord breathes his life and spirit into all of creation. For in Christ, we have all made it.


